
What Is S.A.V.E.

- SAVE is a Volunteer Organization of the Reno Police Department
- SAVE Officers Relieve Reno Police Officers of Certain Duties, Allowing the RPD Officers More Time for Crime Prevention
- SAVE Officers Provide an Increased Level of Crime Prevention Through Patrol and Observation
- SAVE was Organized in 1997
- SAVE Has About 100 Active Volunteer Officers on Duty
- SAVE Officers Conduct Car Patrols Within the City of Reno
- SAVE Officers are Provided With a Badge and Uniform









Qualifications To Join S.A.V.E.

- 50 Years of Age or Older
- Ability to Communicate in a Non-confrontational Manner
- Possession of a Valid Nevada Identification Card or Driver's License
- Considered to be in Good Health
- Willingness to Provide 16 Hours per Month of Service
- Ability to Find Own Transportation To and From the SAVE Office
- Complete a Criminal Background Check



S.A.V.E. Training

- Attend a 2-hour Orientation
- Participate in a Ride-along with an RPD Officer
- Become Familiar with RPD's Radio Dispatch by Observing 911 Dispatchers
- Complete seven 4-Hour Training Patrols with a SAVE Patrol Training Officer
- Attend a 1-Hour Training Meeting Each Month

- Walking the Downtown Corridor as Goodwill Ambassadors
- Patrolling Shopping Centers
- Reno City Hall Front Desk
- Traffic Surveys Radar Speed Monitoring
- Abandoned Vehicle Enforcement
- Participation in Special Events Such as Senior Fest
- Vacation House Checks
- Patrolling Parks and Schools
- Attending RPD Morning Briefings
